



## MARKING THE CHRISTIAN SCIENCE WEEKLY LESSON SERMON

For marking books: Each Bible citation begins with the book title and chapter. In both books, the number following the colon is the verses or lines to read. Example: James 3:11, 12

If an *italicized word* follows, this is the first word to begin that passage; otherwise, start with the first word of the Bible verse or the beginning of the sentence in Science and Health. Example: Job: 7:4 *I am*

Read to the end of the Bible verse, and in Science and Health, red to the last line indicated in the citation.

The word Selah is not read because of its uncertain Biblical meaning, except when it appears in II Kings 14:7, where it refers to a location.

In Science and Health, if there is only one line number, read to the end of the paragraph. Occasionally, there may be more than one sentence on a line. Stop at the end of the first sentence, unless otherwise indicated.

Example  
S&H 277:7

Below are the markings that are easy to use.

1. Mark each section with Roman numerals - I, II, III, IV, V, VI
2. Beginning of citation
3. End of citation
4. Citation continued on to the next page. →
5. When there is more than one marker on the page, write the number of the citation by the markings.
6. End section use X
7. End of Lesson XX

When marking the Lesson, please be careful that the chalk marks do not touch any of the words in the passages from the Lesson so it is easily read.

There are many ways to erase the previous lesson. One of the easier ways to mark the books is to erase all markings and leave the markers in place. Then when you mark the next week's citation, pull that numbered marker to the current marked citation.

Example

God is Love.

Each week you will need to erase the previous weeks lesson. Use a chamois or ultra suede eraser that can be purchased in the Reading Room. You don't need a regular eraser to remove chalk unless it is really a dark mark.
